
Outlets of Little Rock, the only outlet shopping center in Arkansas, features some of the nation's best brand names, including Banana Republic Factory Store, Brooks Brothers Factory Outlet, Clarks Outlet, Cole Haan, Gap Factory Store, JCrew | crewcuts Factory, LOFT Outlet, Nike Factory Store, Old Navy Outlet, RH Outlet and Under Armour. Adjacent to the only Bass Pro Shops store in Arkansas and with no other outlet center within 138 miles, Outlets of Little Rock fills a significant retail void in the market and is a strong statewide draw. The center has excellent highway access and visibility with its location at the intersection of I-30 and I-430, with 95,000 cars driving by the site daily.

The demographics are excellent, with nearly 40% of the state's population living within 60 miles of the site. Little Rock has more than 20 institutions of higher learning with approximately 65,000 students. Pulaski County, the county in which the project is located, attracts 5.7 million annual visitors.

Little Rock is a very unique city, encompassing a community with premier national attractions, a superb quality of life, and world-class appeal. The largest city in Arkansas and the state capital, Little Rock has a strong tourism market, with key attractions including the William J. Clinton Presidential Library and the nearby Verizon Arena. 
- Located in Little Rock, the capital city of Arkansas and the most populous city in the state


Market analysis

TOURISM

DRIVE MARKET:

The majority of the drive traffic comes from Arkansas, Texas, Missouri, Louisiana, Illinois and Oklahoma. Visitation is fairly even throughout the year with peak season from May through October.

BUS MARKET:

The year-round bus market comes from within Arkansas and from Oklahoma and other surrounding states including Texas, Missouri, Tennessee, Louisiana and Mississippi.

FLY MARKET:

Bill and Hillary Clinton National Airport is located only 13 miles east of Outlets of Little Rock and is home to six carriers with non-stop service to 14 major U.S. cities. The Arkansas River Trail System winds its way through Little Rock and North Little Rock, connecting 38 parks, six museums and 5,000+ acres of federal, state and local parkland. Thousands of hikers, cyclists, skaters, and joggers flock to the trail to explore its diversity of habitats, landscapes and activities.



Located on the banks of Arkansas River in the Little Rock's River Market District, the William J. Clinton Presidential Center attracts nearly 350,000 visitors annually. It provides 20,000 square feet of exhibit space chronicling American history at the turn of the 21st century and hosts free festivals, musical performances and special events throughout the year.



Outlets of Little Rock is on the major route to the popular resort area, Hot Springs, known as "The American Spa" for its natural hot springs. About 40 miles away from Outlets of Little Rock, Hot Springs National Park is the 15th most visited national park in the country with nearly 1.5 million annual visitors.





In the heart of downtown Little Rock, the River Market District hosts a bustling market hall as well as loft apartments, luxury condominiums, remodeled and newly-developed office and retail space, restaurants, bars, entertainment and cultural venues. Popular annual events such as the Riverfest Music Festival, free Movies in the Park and the Sculpture at the River Market draw visitors year-round.


